making at kaiser permanente results the cyberseminar 1 targeted multiple disciplines and levels of leadership in the decision making process 2 engaged participants using an interactive rather than didactic static format and 3 delivered the evidence in a context relevant to stakeholders stakeholders included members of kaiser permanente s diabetes guideline development team and national and regional implementation leaders for diabetes prevention efforts within kaiser permanente the cyberseminar was well received and served the needs of the guideline development team the presentation focused on a high level summary of the

systematic review evidence comparison of review findings with other systematic reviews a description of implementation issues for included lifestyle interventions a review of cms reimbursement for lifestyle interventions and a discussion about pre identified considerations our key partners at cmi agreed that hearing from people working on implementation of diabetes prevention interventions in different regions was helpful as was being able to query evidence reviewers during and after the cyberseminar guideline developers reported that the cyberseminar would change aspects of guideline and process participants

identified several areas epc reports could address beyond effectiveness and harms that would be particularly helpful to health care organizations including 1 information about implementation and monitoring considerations for included interventions 2 information on important subgroups 3 if applicable information on how reports have been used to inform national guidelines and 4 consistency between report findings and other existing systematic reviews conclusions our pilot cyberseminar shows promise as a dynamic format to link evidence and evidence reviewers to organization specific guideline development and to integrate key

stakeholders into the early guideline development process the success of this effort required both the readiness of the health system and a partnership between evidence reviewers and the health system tumor board reviews provides comprehensive coverage of all topics in oncology each of the 32 chapters focuses on a specific major disease a brief overview of epidemiology and risk factors is followed by a sequence of specific presentations organized by tumors stage or disease classification each discussion features a case presentation that mimics the format of a tumor board presentation and

thus illustrates key diagnostic and management decisions there is also a discussion of the evidence that supports the clinical management decisions taken in the case based on current expert panel guidelines algorithms and decision tree graphics are used extensively to provide visual support of the decision process the combination of case presentations and evidence based management discussions make this volume a unique tool for keeping current with clinical guidelines and provides the reader with a clear understanding of applications of new information for use in daily practice healthcare providers consumers

although guidelines usually included recommendations for a specific action for a given clinical situation 3 usually formulated guidelines to improve quality of care or to defend against a variety of forces outside their specialties 4 generally used committees and oversight bodies to develop and review guidelines 5 usually evolved their own multiple step processes for guideline development by using literature review and clinical consensus among committee members and incorporating outcomes management information 6 disseminated guidelines to all society members at low cost through existing vehicles 7 considered

various provisions for updating guidelines to keep them relevant 8 spent considerable time and money to shape and launch guideline development programs and 9 had varied opinions on guideline recommendations use of legal disclaimers public disclosure and mechanisms to achieve compliance gao also found that it was unable to make any recommendations on guideline development because of the 1 variability in guideline development in the past and in the opinions about how it should proceed in the future and 2 absence of evaluative studies on guideline development and guideline impacts advances in medical

biomedical and health services research have reduced the level of uncertainty in clinical practice clinical practice guidelines cpgs complement this progress by establishing standards of care backed by strong scientific evidence cpgs are statements that include recommendations intended to optimize patient care these statements are informed by a systematic review of evidence and an assessment of the benefits and costs of alternative care options clinical practice guidelines we can trust examines the current state of clinical practice guidelines and how they can be improved to enhance healthcare quality and patient

outcomes clinical practice guidelines now are ubiquitous in our healthcare system the guidelines international network gin database currently lists more than 3 700 guidelines from 39 countries developing guidelines presents a number of challenges including lack of transparent methodological practices difficulty reconciling conflicting guidelines and conflicts of interest clinical practice guidelines we can trust explores questions surrounding the quality of cpg development processes and the establishment of standards it proposes eight standards for developing trustworthy clinical practice guidelines

emphasizing transparency management of conflict of interest systematic review guideline development intersection establishing evidence foundations for and rating strength of guideline recommendations articulation of recommendations external review and updating clinical practice guidelines we can trust shows how clinical practice guidelines can enhance clinician and patient decision making by translating complex scientific research findings into recommendations for clinical practice that are relevant to the individual patient encounter instead of implementing a one size fits all approach to patient care this

book contains information directly related to the work of the agency for healthcare research and quality ahrq as well as various congressional staff and policymakers it is a vital resource for medical specialty societies disease advocacy groups health professionals private and international organizations that develop or use clinical practice guidelines consumers clinicians and payers this book is a study of design initiatives and policies in five us west coast cities seattle including bellevue portland san francisco irvine and san diego all of which have had particularly interesting urban design experience of relevance to practice in britain

and other countries although these cities are not a representative sample of all american design practice they provide a rich vein of ideas about recent policy development and current initiatives which will stimulate thought about the formulation of effective design controls the presentation of substantial extracts from key documents that underpin design controls in the five cities will be of interest inspiration and practical use to academics and practitioners who want to know more about american practice and who want to contribute to improvements in the standards and quality of urban design policies and design control the

an expert panel to develop the heart failure clinical practice guideline phase ii of the effort was intended to identify which of the guideline s recommendations the panel felt were suitable for use in retrospective utilization review and quality assessment programs and to develop review criteria performance measures and standards of quality for use in monitoring compliance with those recommendations selecting guideline recommendations for translation into review criteria and ultimately into standards of care was a multi step process comprising 1 identifcaiton of 34 recommendations from the guideline 2 rating them on the

basis of importance to quality of care and feasibility of monitoring 3 review by a subcommittee and the full guideline panel 4 translation into review criteria and 5 further review and input by panelists and peer and pilot reviewers finally standards of care the minimum proportion of cases expected to be in accordance with guideline recommendations were determined to be 90 95 for six of the final criteria and 75 80 for the other two despite some reservations physicians and other health care professionals agreed to be held accountable for following a core set of guideline recommendations for the treatment of heart failure
